As you may recall I brought my daughter, Jennifer, to you because of a hearing problem. She ~~was~~ had been tested three times at the Lexington School for the Deaf and was found to be ~~to~~ somewhere between profoundly and severely deaf. A visit to the chief otolaryngologist of a well known hospital confirmed the diagnosis and told me that it was a nerve deafness which could not be treated medically.

In addition to your ~~present~~ treatment I also enrolled my daughter in a program for the deaf at the Lexington School for the Deaf where she was given a hearing aid, a speech therapist, etc. Within a few weeks, however, a wonderful thing happened. Her hearing improved remarkably. The ~~best~~ latest test given ~~indicated~~ indicates a hearing loss of only 30% as compared to a previous loss of almost 70%. The Lexington School for the Deaf cannot explain the sudden improvement of her hearing. You

may possibly be the one to credit for
this astounding improvement.

And I ~~am~~ am extremely ~~to~~ optimistic
~~and~~ about her next hearing test scheduled
for June 16. I ~~to~~ now feel all will
be OK. I will ~~also~~ let you know the results.
