Dear Mr Kraft:

I would like to take a few minutes to write you and keep you up to date on my daughter's (Jennifer's) progress.

As you know, I brought Jennifer to you after she had been ~~found~~ tested three times by the Lexington School for the Deaf and found to be between severely and profoundly deaf. I then had my daughter examined by an otolaryngologist at Long Island Jewish Hospital. He said that Jennifer was deaf as a result of a nerve problem. The prognosis of both the doctor and the director of the hearing center at the Lexington School for the Deaf was that my daughter would be deaf from a condition that could not be cured.

~~Then~~ I then took my daughter to you ^{on April 27} for treatment as a last ~~hope~~ ^{effort}. ~~Immediately~~ ^{soon} after treatment began I noticed an improvement in my daughter. She seemed to become more responsive to my voice and other voices. She seemed to improve

steadily and on May 28, 1976 she was retested by the Lexington School for the Deaf. ~~etc~~ They found that her hearing improved from approximately 30% of normal to 70% of ~~normal~~ normal hearing.

The Lexington School for the Deaf has not been able to offer an explanation of her sudden improvement in hearing. They removed her hearing aid and told us she could no longer be enrolled in a program for the deaf.

It is possible that this improvement in Jennifer's hearing is attributable to your intervention since medical science cannot offer any other explanation. Jennifer is scheduled for retesting on July 12, 1976 and I am optimistic for continued improvement. I shall keep you informed as Jennifer progresses.
